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When It's Hot, It's Hot:

The Simple Joys of Baking Microwave Mug Cakes in the Summertime

When is it too hot to bake a cake? Never, if it's a microwave mug cake. At least that's what Stacey J. Miller, author of *101 Recipes for Microwave Mug Cakes*, has discovered.

Miller, who works at home, loves to putter around in the kitchen. "Let's face it. You probably can make it yourself – whatever it is – better, more quickly, and more cheaply if you make it at home," she says. But she admits that sometimes it's just too hot to turn on the oven. "At those times, I'll do the nasty deed – I'll order pizza, stir-fried veggies, or eggplant parmesan -- instead of cooking my favorite homemade versions."

But one thing Miller never compromises on is quick, homemade snacks. "When I want a few bites of something sweet, soft, and fresh from the oven, there's just no way I'm going to a doughnut shop or buying something in a box," she insists. "I don't want to heat up the kitchen, but I also don't want to sacrifice the instant gratification I can get from baking it myself. That's when I pull together the simple ingredients I always have on hand to make myself a microwave mug cake." Miller boasts that a fringe benefit of baking a microwave mug cake – a single-serving snack that takes less than 5 minutes to bake in the microwave oven – is that she doesn't have to haul out heavy equipment, such as a mixer, blender, or food processor. All she needs is a bowl, a spoon, and a large microwave-proof mug. "What could be simpler than that?" asks Miller. "And what could be more rewarding than pulling a
